The **Tragic accident takes** is to **five lives**

Our church family is in shock and grief at the passing of our sister in Christ Joyce Collier.

Joyce was killed in a car accident near Cross Plains on December 26. Her son-in-law James Hurley was also killed. Other passengers in the van were Joyce's daughter Lisa Collier, Lisa's two daughters Gracie and Emily, and Joyce's grandsons William, Joshua, and Hayden. All sustained injuries that were not life-threatening.

A couple from Forney, Bryan and Debra Mikulik, were in the other vehicle involved and were also killed in the collision. Their two teenage daughters were injured. Olivia, age 14, passed away from her injuries on Sunday, Dec. 30.

The accident happened when the van James was driving hydroplaned in the rain and crossed into the oncoming lane.

Services for Joyce and James will be at 2:00 Wednesday, January 2, at Robert Massie Funeral Home in San Angelo, with visitation from 11:00 to 1:00. Burial will be at 12:00 noon on Friday, January 4, at Morris Ranch Hilcrest Cemetery in Fredericksburg.

Joyce was an active member of our church and will be sorely missed.

Keith's Konnections

First, let me say that I hope and pray that ALL of you had wonderful, faith-filled Christmas and an enjoyable time with family and friends this past week. Now we get ready for a new year!!! And a new year always brings about "New Year's Resolutions" which few of us ever follow through on until even the end of January. We promise to lose weight, to get in better shape (and I always thought that ROUND WAS a shape), to quit this or that or to start doing this or that. How about if we look at this new year from a more Christ-centered view and try to be more compassionate, more caring, more loving, more involved with our church, more LIKE CHRIST!!! After all, is that not what each of us is called to do? That process is oftentimes called "sanctification" or simply, becoming more Christ-like every day. May I ask you a few questions? Are you the same Christian today that you were 5 years ago? If not, YOU have a problem! Do you read your Bible more today that you did 5 years ago? If not, YOU have a problem! Do you understand more about Christian living today than you did 5 years ago, and put what you have learned into practice? If not, YOU have a problem. You (and I) are doing a good job of letting God sanctify us as He chooses to do.

I truly believe that when we are saved, we are not only saved TO something but FOR something as well, and I also believe that when we are saved, God gives us spiritual gifts that are to be used to further His Kingdom work. "And he gave some, apostles; and some, prophets; and some, evangelists; and some, pastors and teachers; for the perfecting of the saints, for the work of the ministry, for the edifying of the body of Christ:" (Eph. 4:11-12) I also truly believe that the local pastor's main responsibility is to equip and perfect the saints for the work of the ministry. Of course, when Paul penned this epistle, he did not use any punctuation, and if you take the comma out of the sentence between saints and for, it gives it an entirely different meaning. "for the perfecting of the saints for the work of the ministry." The saints (which, by the way, are you and me) are to at least help the pastor in the work of the ministry. There are a multitude of spiritual gifts (see I Cor. 12), but they are ALL given for a singular purpose and that is to further the Kingdom of God.

Therefore, my challenge to each of our churches for 2019 is to do what God has called "the church" to do and BE in the 21st century, and in reality, the churches' mission has not changed. And of course, when I say "the church", what that actually means is each member of the church. Here is Luke's take on what the church was about in the first century and what we still need to be about today: "And they continued steadfastly in the apostles' doctrine and fellowship, and in breaking of bread, and in prayers." The apostles' doctrine refers to studying and teaching of God's word and the application thereof. (James 1:22 KJV). "But be ye doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving your own selves." Fellowship means supporting one another, or as Paul is fond of saying, the edification of the church. (Be a Barnabas, the Encourager.) Observance of the Lord's Supper in order to remind us of the great sacrifice that was made on our behalf, especially when we were without Christ. "But God commended His love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us." (Rom. 5:8 KJV) And of course, pray, pray, pray. A church which does not pray together cannot stay together. Pray for one another, pray for the leaders of the church, pray for the lost souls of your community, and above all, pray for your pastor, for "to whom much is given, much is expected." He needs your prayers more than anyone else in the church.

And let me reiterate this again. If you or your church needs help in some area, please let us know. We have team leaders in place that are willing to come to your church and help you with strategic planning, leadership, evangelism, discipleship, and so forth. And of course, please feel free to call me at any time. I may not have an answer to your problem, but as we work through it together, YOU will come up with your own solutions. May God continue to bless and keep you, may His face shine upon you, and may each church deliver up to Christ that which He desires.


