Thought For The Day:
"We can come to God trusting that He hears our sighs, feels our hurts, & sees our tears. When we see God for who He is, we will see ourselves for who we are."

We need to remember that the Bible, both the Old Testament and the New Testament were mostly written without punctuation, (I am not even sure who INVENTED punctuation) therefore leaving open to question, not the validity of the Scriptures, but rather how one interprets those same Scriptures. Let me give you an example. Ephesians 4:12-14 King James Version (**KJV**) 12 "For the **perfecting of the saints**, for the work of the ministry, for the edifying of the body of Christ: 13 Till we all come in the unity of the faith, and of the knowledge of the Son of God, unto a perfect man, unto the measure of the stature of the fulness of Christ:"

However, if we remove the comma between the words "saints" and the word "for" we get a different interpretation. "For the perfecting of the saints for the work of the ministry---" So which is the most correct. I will not get into that discussion; however, I feel that it is better to omit the comma, thereby rendering it to mean that a pastor is supposed to be equipping the "saints" to do the work of the ministry. One of the tenets of Baptists is the idea of "the priesthood of all believers," which means that we are ALL called to be priests or ministers of the Gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ. If you expect your pastor to do EVERYTHING, I think you miss the meaning of the idea that both clergy AND lay people are in ministry TOGETHER. Somehow we have gotten the wrong idea that it is the pastor's job to PRODUCE and it is laity's job to CONSUME. Both are incorrect. A good pastor will EQUIP his people to produce and not just consume, by not only allowing them to take part in the ministry, but also insisting that they do so. Each Christian is CHARGED with the idea that we are to share the WORD, in word and deed. "Therefore go and make disciples of all nations---". Notice that Jesus did not say just to the preachers to do so, but to his disciples to make other disciples.

Is your pastor equipping you? Is he challenging you to do more? Is he asking you to become a better disciple and to make other disciples? If not, then maybe you need to have a little talk with him and encourage him to ALLOW you, as a church member, to not only BE a disciple, but rather to MAKE disciples. When is the last time you shared your faith with someone? When is the last time that you went out of your way to show the love of Christ? When was the last time that you rejoiced with the angels in Heaven when a person gets saved? I realize how busy all of us are with jobs, families, activities of all kinds, and etc., but we need to remember that "Whatever we do, we need to do it to the glory of God." Our main JOB is winning souls and making disciples, what we do for a living is our VOCATION. We spend time with our family, but why not spend more time with the family of GOD? Why not become involved in the activities of your community and represent Christ in those activities?

Every one of us needs to be trained in some ways: for example, someone trained you to use eating utensils, how to tie your shoes, how to dress yourself, how to read, and how to work. We need discipleship training in our churches in order to spur us on to actions, to become the disciples that we need to be, and to bring others into the fold. We will be implementing in the near future a Pastor Mentorship/Leadership program to equip our pastors to do a better job, and in turn to equip them to better minister to the flock, to encourage the flock, and to challenge the flock. We are excited about this program and see that this could impact each of our pastors and our churches as well. Encourage your pastor to attend these five sessions that we will be hosting over the next year in order that he may be better equipped to equip the saints to do the work of the ministry.


