## Keith's Konnections

"And let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us,

<sup>2</sup>fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith.

For the <u>iov</u> set before him he endured the cross,

scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God.

<sup>3</sup> Consider him who endured such opposition from sinners,

so that you will not grow weary and lose heart."

(Hebrews 12:2.3 NIV)

Does it ever seem as if living the Christian life is too difficult? Do you oftentimes desire to give up? Re-read the Scripture above and notice one word in that statement: the word JOY. Do you think that going to the cross for Jesus was a happy time? I dare say not. His JOY came, not from what he was about to endure, but rather KNOWING that He was going home once again, and that he would be seated in His rightful place. We all go through some things in life that do not bring happiness, yet through those times we can still rejoice in the fact that the JOY that awaits us is far better than anything on this earth. Jesus did not lose heart as He faced the cross and He encourages us not to lose heart when we go through trials and tribulations in our lives. He also says in Hebrews 13:5 (b), "Never will I leave you; never will I forsake you." Also in Hebrews 12:28, He says, "Therefore, since we are receiving a kingdom that cannot be shaken, let us be thankful, and so worship God acceptably with reverence and awe, for our 'God is a consuming fire.""

Someone once said, "We must do all the good we can, to all we can, for as long as we can." Our role as Christians is to make an impact on our world. Even if our world is small, we can still have a great influence on those around us either by word or deed or both. What will bring others to know Christ is watching Christians, how they act, and what they say and do; especially when we go through tests. Remember that "God can take a test and turn it into a testimony and He can take a trial and turn it into a triumph." Let others see God working in and through your situation, glorify Him in the good and the bad, and always be joyful, knowing the result is in His hands. God did NOT deliver Daniel from the lions' den; He did not deliver Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego from the fire; and He did not deliver Christ from the cross. But even in the midst of those trials, God was working. God will oftentimes allow us to go THROUGH trials and tribulations to grow us in the faith, to mature us in our walk with Him, and to draw us closer to relying on Him. Sometimes God calms the storm, but sometimes God calms us in the midst of the storm.

We need to build one another up, or as Paul says, to edify one another. We each need encouragement during our times of trouble, a friend to stay beside us, and God to guide us. I heard it said one time that "When Christians come together, their joys are doubled and their burdens are divided." We are NEVER alone in the Christian walk, and I truly believe that is why God established "the church" in the New Testament Book of Acts. They met together, they studied together, they prayed together, they shared together and they built one another up at all times. Let us do the same.

And let us not forget that Easter is upcoming the 21<sup>st</sup> of April. Let us celebrate the RISEN CHRIST. Had He not died and had He not risen, we would still be lost in our sins. We are the first - fruits of His resurrection. I know several places will be hosting Easter Son Rise Services, and I encourage you to attend the one of your choice, and I feel sure that you will receive a blessing from that event. God bless and keep doing God's work until He comes again.
