Keith's Konnections

Well, it's that time of year again: that time when all sorts of things are going on. We just finished Easter (and what a joyous time in the life of all Christians), and coming up, we have Mother's Day, graduations, schools releasing, vacations, Vacation Bible Schools, camps of all sorts including Church Camps, basketball camps, football camps, tennis camps and so on and so on. It seems that as we approach this time of year, our lives get busier and busier as each new event approaches, and we sometimes forget about church activities. We tend to put church on the "back burner" as summer arrives, but God calls us to "not forsake the assembling of yourselves together." Church attendance and church giving tend to go down somewhat during this busy time of the year, but it should not be so.

Paul encourages us to "finish the race" and to continue to do the work to which God has called us. What is your "job" as a Christian? The trip will leave on July 13 and return on July 20 and all are invited to participate in our summer mission trip. 
