Message from the Pastor

There was a farmer who went to buy some mouse traps and the mice found out about it. On the day the mice found out they went to the barn and told the chicken, pig, and cow they needed to speak with them. The mice told the other three animals that the farmer just bought some mouse traps. The chicken, pig, and the cow laughed at the mice and told them, "That's your problem, not ours!" The mice looked back at the other animals and told them again that the farmer bought some mouse traps.



About a week later a poisonous snake got caught in the mouse trap and a few minutes later that farmer's wife walked by the trap. The poisonous snake, who was not dead yet, bit her. So now the farmer's wife was poisoned by the snake who was caught in the mouse trap. As the poison was going through her body and she was beginning to feel sick, she went into the house. Her husband asked what he could do to help
