Message from the Pastor: Hiding God's Word in your heart

One of the things that has been on my heart for FBC Brady this past year is growing as disciples of Jesus. The meaning of the word *disciple* is someone who learns from a teacher. In the days of the New Testament, young boys would become disciples or learners of rabbis in the Torah (first five books of the Bible) and the prophets. One of the things that these young boys would have to do is memorize major portions of the Torah and the writing of the prophets.

One of the things the Bible tells the disciples of Jesus or learners of Jesus is to guard our hearts so that we might not sin against Him. If we are honest with ourselves, memorizing God's Word is something that we just don't want to do. We will memorize lyrics of favorite songs, sports stats, gun facts, and the list goes on and on. What I want you to understand is that memorizing God's Word is a privilege, not a duty. I think too many times we see learning Scripture as a duty; that is not how God wants us to see it. I will be honest with you, though. When we are trying to memorize God's Word, it will take time and effort. The question is why should we memorize God's Word—other than the fact that He told us to. I want to give you three reasons.

First, memorizing God's Word honors Him. One of my favorite Psalms out of the 150 to choose from is Psalm 119. When you go read all 176 verses, notice the honor the writer heaps on God and His Word:

Psalm 119:89 – "LORD, your word is forever; it is firmly fixed in heaven." Psalm 119:105 – "Your word is a lamp for my feet and a light to my path." Psalm 119:140 – "Your word is completely pure, and your servant loves it." Psalm 119:162 – "I rejoice over your promise like one who finds vast treasure."

The reason the writer values God's Word so much is that he values God. You see, my brothers and sisters in Christ, God's Word is a reflection of Himself. It is a revelation or unveiling of His mind. Memorizing Scripture is sometimes called *hiding God's Word in your heart*. When we do that, we are also hiding God there. Remember, God only wrote one book, and we honor Him when we show respect to that Book – the Bible – by hiding it in our hearts. "How I love your instruction! It is my meditation all day long." (Psalm 119:97)

A second reason for hiding God's Word is to keep you and me from sinning against God and one another. The writer of Psalm 119:11 says, "I have treasured your word in my heart so that I may not sin against you." When we are tempted to sin every day, we need a premier defense. God has provided that defense in His Word. In Matthew 4, Mark 1, Luke 4 we read about the temptation of Jesus by Satan. Notice that Jesus used Scripture to fight off the temptations that Satan tried to use. When Satan and his demons come for you, how will you fight them off if you don't know the Word of God? Jesus is a great example of what we do when we are tempted. If you have prepared yourself for temptation by hiding God's Word in your heart by memorizing it, the Holy Spirit will bring those verses to your mind when you need them the most. God's Word will save you from spiritual reverses. Hide God's Word in your heart so you do not sin against Him.

A third reason to memorize Scripture is to prepare yourself to answer those who challenge your faith in Christ. There are going to be people out in the world that are not happy that you are a Christian. Individuals will try to convince you to abandon your faith in Christ. Satan will put things in your life to make you question your faith. In fact, some people will even bring up who you were before you became a Christian. When this happens, you will be glad you have memorized God's Word.

The Apostle Peter gave us some good advice when he said, "but in your hearts regard Christ the Lord as holy, ready at any time to give a defense to anyone who asks you for a reason for the hope that is in you" (1 Peter 3:15). Since we never know when you will have to give that defense, we must be ready all the time. This requires memorizing Scripture consistently. Our memory verse for the month of October is Acts 4:12, so that is a great place to start. The best part is that it draws us closer to Jesus, like these old words from Augustus M. Toplady says, "Rock of Ages, cleft for me, Let me hide myself in Thee."


