## Message from the Pastor: Wear the Armor!

There was a young man named Kevin who was excited about getting his new beehive. Ever since he was a young boy, Kevin always wanted to become a beekeeper. Kevin had a friend from church named Val who was the main beekeeper at the local zoo that helped Kevin set up his hive and guide the bees that Kevin bought into their new home. Val shared valuable information about handling the bees and gave Kevin specific instructions about what to do, but Kevin was so mesmerized watching the bees that he did not hear most of the instructions.

Days passed and Kevin went out to tend the bees. He put on his bee suit, put the helmet and veil over his head, and slipped on the gloves. Kevin then walked up the hill where the hive was and removed the top. He worked for a few minutes and then let out a bloodcurdling yell that would shake a deaf person to their bones. When Kevin's wife looked out the window, she saw him running down the hill towards the creek with a swarm of bees following him. Jumping in the creek helped Kevin lose the bees, but he did not escape unscathed.

Kevin did not listen to the specific instructions that Val had told him about how to correctly put the bee suit on. Kevin put it on incorrectly and the bees had gotten inside the veil and his clothes, stinging him as he tried to escape. Not listening closely to the instructions that Val told him caused a very painful situation for Kevin.

We can learn a lot from this story about Kevin and his new beehive. The Bible tells us in 1 Peter 5:8, "Be sober, be vigilant; because your adversary the devil walks about like a roaring lion, seeking whom he may devour (NKJV)". The devil will do everything in his power to stop you and me from coming close to God. God, through the Holy Spirit has given us this news ahead of time and has given us a suit to wear to help shield His followers from the enemy's attacks. We find that clothing otherwise known as the armor of God mentioned in Ephesians 6:10-18. Not listening to God's instructions can cause us pain that He never wanted his followers to go through. The writer Joseph Scriven put it this way:

What a friend we have in Jesus, all our sins and griefs to bear! What a privilege to carry everything to God in prayer! Oh, what peace we often forfeit, oh, what needless pain we bear, All because we do not carry everything to God in prayer!

Reading God's word every day and listening for His still small voice will shield us from getting stung from the situations that will harm us. Paul reminds us in 1 Corinthians 10:13, "No temptation has come upon you except what is common to humanity. But God is faithful; he will not allow you to be tempted beyond what you are able, but with the temptation he will also provide a way out so that you may be able to bear it. (CSB)".

Just as wearing the bee suit properly would have protected Kevin, wearing the armor of righteousness will protect you and me. May the Lord Jesus, help you and me listen to His instructions and to wear the armor of God well. I leave you with the words of King Solomon in Proverbs 1:7, "Fear of the LORD is the foundation of true knowledge, but fools despise wisdom and discipline (NLT)".

There are those in our midst who do things around our church that are not part of any committee, mission team, class, etc. They just see something that needs to be done and do it. I know I haven't thought of everyone, but you get the idea.

Thank you to:

Jerry Caraway, Jason Behrens, and Gage Behrens keep our church grounds mowed and looking good as well as working on our church vehicles, changing high-up light bulbs, and so much more.

**Bobby Williams**—I always feel safer knowing he walks the halls with eyes for our safety. He is always ready to assist those needing wheelchairs or help getting in and out our doors. And he faithfully takes our loads of donated items to the border.

Travis Gary and George Matula lead our Food Pantry ministry. Travis orders food from the San Angelo Food Bank and figures out how many pounds of food to give out each month. George checks thermometers in the freezers, logs in what we get from Walmart, checks thermostats in the sanctuary and rooms, makes sure doors are closed and locked, turns out lights, and sees to other economically saving matters.

A faithful team of **Food Pantry workers** pick up food from Walmart <u>every Thursday</u> and put it up on shelves, in freezers, or in refrigerators. Then those same folks plus a few others work on our distribution day each month.

Marsha Gainer has almost single-handedly kept our Children's Ministry going during this time of Covid. For many months she served as Sunday School teacher, Children's Church teacher, and nursery worker on Sunday morning, Sunday night, and Wednesday night. (Thankfully we now have a nursery worker on Sunday mornings, and rotating Children's Church workers.)

Jason Behrens, Gage Behrens, and Robert Tetens work the media and sound-board system every Sunday during church.

Bev Waisner and Laura Alsop are making Bible book bags for the preschool graduates. These will hold children's Bibles the church is providing.

For sure some important people have been left out of this article, and for that I'm sorry. You are appreciated too! It takes all of us doing those big and little jobs to keep our church being all it can be.

When Jesus had finished washing their feet, He put on His clothes and returned to His place. "Do you understand what I have done for you?" He asked them.
