Message from the Pastor: VBS, salvation, and sharing your story *by Jeff Quattlebaum*

It was a crazy week that had months of prayer, preparation, and excitement for how God was going to move in so many young lives. The week I am speaking of is Vacation Bible School and it is one of the most important events in the life of any church. There are many things I love about the week, the smiles on the kids' faces, and I really like seeing adults remembering their experiences from VBS when they were young. The most important day for me is when the gospel is presented to the kids and seeing the Holy Spirit work on their souls. Jesus tells us in Luke 9:26, "For whoever is ashamed of me and my words, the Son of Man will be ashamed of him when he comes in his glory and that of the Father and the holy angels." Jesus tells us that after we have put our faith and trust in Him, we need to go tell individuals about Him.

In the Bible we see a man whose name is Andrew who would later become one of Jesus' disciples. When he trusted Jesus as Savior, the took a very important step in telling someone about Jesus. Andrew would quickly tell his very own brother. John 1:41 tells us, *"He first found his own brother Simon and told him, "We have found the Messiah" (which is translated "the Christ")*. Andrew's explanation of his salvation experience was not long, not detailed, and definitely not theological. You see Andrew was a fisherman, not a theologian and in the coming years he would learn more about God. He simply told his brother Simon what he had found.

No one expects a new believer to have all the answers or all the right terminology just after he/she has been saved. I don't think God expects that either. All we need to do is to go tell someone what has happened to us. Tell others that Jesus has become real to us, that He has come into our lives and saved us. Jesus wants you and me to be His witnesses to those around us. Acts 1:8 says, *"But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come on you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth."*

Talking about your salvation experience may not be easy, and we may not comprehend everything that happened when we were saved. Sharing your life in Christ with others will help us in a number of ways. It will help clarify your thinking because you will be able to separate the questions you have in your mind from the facts that you do know. It will bring your friends, family, and those you meet face to face with God's love for them. Vance Havner once said, "We have a story to tell to the nations, but it is also a story to tell to the neighbors."

One caution I will give you is when you tell someone what has happened to you, do not start an argument or debate. People do not come to Christ at the end of an argument, but they frequently come to Him at the end of a testimony. Be genuine. Be kind. Be patient. Let the love of God that brought you to Him be reflected in the way in which you tell others about Him. The greatest thing that will happen to you in your life is salvation. Go, tell someone what Jesus has done for you by His grace and mercy. Charles Wesley put it this way, "O for a thousand tongues to sing my great Redeemer's praise, the glories of my God and King, the triumphs of His grace."

The Son of God became a man so that men could become the sons of God. At Vacation Bible School over 10 kids put their faith in Jesus Christ because of a group of people who were willing to tell them what Jesus did in their own lives. There were also many seeds planted in the hearts of other kids and families as well. What is stopping you from being like Andrew and going to tell someone what you have found? In John 9 Jesus healed a man of being blind since he was born and when the Pharisees asked the blind man who healed him the blind man responded this way: *"Whether or not he's a sinner, I don't know. One thing I do know: I was blind, and now I can see!" (John 9:25).* My brothers and sisters, you might not have all the theological answers but what I do know is that at one point we were blind and held captive in our sins. Jesus came along, took that away and now we can see. I close with the famous words of John Newton:

Amazing grace, how sweet the sound that saved a wretch like me! I once was lost but now I am found, was blind, but now I see.

Will you go tell your story?
