Message from the Pastor: What does your Bible look like?

It happens every New Year's Day, a resolution that many Disciples of Jesus will commit to having a quiet time. Many of the resolutions say that the Disciple will have a better quiet time, or it will happen every day without fail. When the month of January starts for the first couple of days to weeks everything is going great, then something happens. We skip a day, life gets busy, and before you know it there is no quiet time anymore. This happens to every believer in Jesus in seasons of our lives and I have been asked by students I used to teach, "Why even have a quiet time alone with Jesus?"

To grow in our faith in Christ Jesus we need a time that is set aside where we can be alone with God and dive into His Word. Psalm 119:97 tells us, "*How I love your instruction! It is my meditation all day long.*"* In the businesses of modern life, we can find ourselves in a situation where it is easy to live our lives with little or no regard for what Christ did on the cross to save us. We can disregard the plan of salvation that God put into place that cost the precious life of His only Son. We are reminded of this in Romans 3:25 when Paul says, "*God presented him as an atoning sacrifice in his blood, received through faith, to demonstrate his righteousness, because in his restraint God passed over the sins previously committed.*"

The Bible is the revelation of God's mind to you and me. Not only did God give His one and only Son – the Living Word – to redeem us, He gave us His Scriptures – the Written Word – to guide us.

Many people own a Bible and in the United States the average number of Bibles in a household is between 4 to 5 Bibles. Statistics tell us that 36 percent of Americans read the Bible less than once a year and 33 percent read the Bible once or more a week. For most people, the Bible is known as an out-of-date book that is only good for their grandparents, but not for them. I will admit that when you read the Bible, some sections of the Bible are difficult to understand, and some are not as exciting as other parts. John Bunyan, the author of *Pilgrim's Progress*, once said, "I have sometimes seen more in a line of the Bible than I could understand; and yet at other times the whole Bible has been to me as dry as a stick." Still, every part of the Bible has something to say to you and me which makes every passage very important. Robert A. Cook tells us, "Never leave a passage of Scripture until it has said something to you."

Another question that I get multiple times is when should I have my quiet time? It is very important for you and me to read the Bible as often as possible. I would also say to have a specific time each day when we can shut the rest of the world out and just meet with God. Jesus demonstrated this multiple times when he was on earth. For example in Mark 1:35 it says, "*Very early in the morning while it was still dark, he got up, went out, and made his way to a deserted place; and there he was praying.*" David said in Psalm 63:1, "*God, you are my God; I eagerly seek you. I thirst for you; my body faints for you in a land that is dry, desolate, and without water.*" So, find a time that suits your lifestyle best and stick with it.

The third question I get asked many times is what are some good pieces of advice you would give or what do I do during my quiet times. So, my first piece of advice is to do what it says in Psalm 46:10, to be still at the feet of Jesus and pray. Ask the Holy Spirit to prepare you to meet with God, confess your sins, praise and give thanks to God as well. If there are things that hinder your meeting with God, confess it and ask Him to forgive you. My second piece of advice is to read a specific part of scripture. I would suggest one or two chapters to start off with and if you're not very familiar with the Bible, start in the New Testament. I also suggest reading the Psalms and Proverbs as well. If you still don't know what to read, ask the Holy Spirit to guide you in what to read for that particular day. Third, after you read the passage of Scripture, meditate on it for a while. Think about what you just read and seek what God wants you to learn from it. I personally like to journal and make notes in my Bible when I am reading as well. My fourth piece of advice is to write down questions about the passage you have just read. James tells us in verse 5 of chapter 1, "*Now if any of you lacks wisdom, he should ask God – who gives to all generously and ungrudgingly – and it will be given to him.*" God is big enough to handle your questions. I write questions and later I can find out answers by asking other people or searching reference material. The fifth piece of advice I would give is to read the passage a second or third time because I learn new things that I didn't see the first time. The last piece of advice I would give you is to pray again.

Consistency is the key to maintaining a quiet time in a world that is fast paced that is pulling you everywhere. If we are not careful and not watching, somehow God will get squeezed out. If you just sample the Word of God, honestly you probably won't develop much of a taste for it. You MUST come back to God's table and soak up His Word daily. Open your Bible regularly. Open it prayerfully, read the Bible expectantly, trust the Bible implicitly, and live it constantly. The great preacher of the 19th century Charles Spurgeon once said, "A Bible that is falling apart usually belongs to someone who isn't."

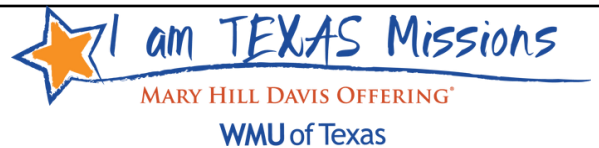
Also, Bro. Jeff is doing a Facebook Live Bible study on Sunday evenings at 6:00 while we are not meeting as a congregation.
