Message from the Pastor: Through It All

The year was 1971 when a little-known song was written by a famous gospel singer named Andraé Crouch. The gospel group called Andraé Crouch and the Disciples were on a tour through California when he was in a season of very deep disillusionment and disappointment that would border on depression. On top of all that, Andraé's mother and father had passed away within two years of one another. He said of that time, "Probably the hardest time in my life... Just getting through the gloom, the grieving part of it and to learn the reason why." Later on, in Andraé's life he would be diagnosed and fight through four different types of cancer and congestive heart failure. While many of us would probably just give up and pray that God would just take us home, Andraé kept pushing through and ministering through music to millions of people around the world.

Andraé Crouch described in an article about a time of prayer he was having at his lowest point. He was praying to God saying, "I cannot praise You going through this. I cannot do it. I don't feel like it." Brothers and sisters in Christ, that moment hit me really hard because we have all been there. We have all gone through things and we tell God that we just can't do it anymore. We have all told God at one point, "I cannot praise You going through this, I can't do it and I don't want to do it no matter what you say." Crouch went on to say that after struggling for about 30 minutes, he gave in. "I just started saying, 'Thank you, Jesus, and I praise you, Jesus.' And then I felt strength come like a gushing well." Through that experience Crouch said God taught him a very valuable lesson: "If depression comes for anything, learn to praise Him. There is power in praising the name of God."

In his autobiography, written by Andraé Edward Crouch and Nina Ball, he wrote these words: "But God sends the mountains... to lift us up from the valleys ... and He gives us strength to travel through it all – through the up times and through the down times. I just thank Him for everything, all the tears – tears of sorrow, tears of joy – for the problems, and the trust, the faith, His Word, His Holy Spirit, and for Jesus. Through it all he brings a blessed harmony to life. Knowing Him, belonging to Him, is enough. Praise His name." (*Crouch*, 1974, p.17)

Through the experiences of his life, Andraé Crouch was able to pen a little-known song that would become one of his most famous songs in 1971, titled "Through It All." The chorus goes like this:

Through it all, through it all, I've learned to trust in Jesus; I've learned to trust in God. Through it all, through it all, I've learned to depend upon His Word.

Brothers and Sisters at FBC Brady, this is what my family and I have learned from many of the saints that have called FBC their church home while we have been serving these past three years. No matter what comes our way, we can trust in God, and He will see us through. As I sit here and write these words we are in a season in the life of our church where we are in the valley. I have noticed that there are some of my brothers and sisters are who are nervous, and it looks like Satan is just having a field day trying to tear us apart. The reason Satan is trying to tear us apart and using members of the church to do his work is because God has a bright future for FBC Brady in this community and Satan doesn't want it to happen. I would like to close this final newsletter article with these powerful words from our brother in Christ, Andraé Crouch, and that so many of you have taught me and my family:

So, I thank God for the mountains and I thank Him for the valleys and I thank Him for the storms He's brought us through. For if I'd never had a problem, I'd never know God could solve them, I'd never know what faith in His Word could do. That's the reason I say that, through it all, through it all, I've learned to trust in Jesus, I've learned to trust in God. Through it all, through it all, I've learned to depend upon His Word.

Keep looking up to Christ and moving forward. Thank you for everything and we will always love FBC Brady.

FBC Brady Resolution on Transgender/Non-Binary Issues

WHEREAS, the Bible is the authority for faith and practice by Texas Baptists, and First Baptist Church of Brady; and

WHEREAS, the Bible states that God created humanity as two genders, male and female, and this includes Jesus' own affirmation (**Genesis 1:27; Matthew 19:4; Mark 10:6**) and that said person shall only use the bathrooms as determined by God's ordained gender; and

WHEREAS, in the Bible gender is based on biological attributes and is seen as a gift from God and immutable; and

WHEREAS, some people today are expressing a desire to identify themselves with the gender which differs from their biological gender; and

WHEREAS, some of these persons are seeking to function in the broader society as if they are members of the gender that differs from their biological gender; therefore

BE IT RESOLVED that First Baptist Church of Brady expresses great concern with the emergence of the transgender/non-Binary agenda and the notion that one's gender is determined psychologically, not biologically; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that we the members of First Baptist Church of Brady affirm that these persons shall not hold membership of First Baptist Church, serve on committees, teach any class be it Sunday School, Children, Youth, or Adult;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that we the members of First Baptist Church of Brady affirm that these persons cannot be married in or use any of the First Baptist Church property for any such ceremonies;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that we the members of First Baptist Church of Brady affirm that in creation God made male and female as biological gender assignments; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that we the members of First Baptist Church of Brady desire for all people, including those who consider themselves transgender or non-binary, to be treated with love and respect but that such love and respect not be construed as approval for every behavior, and

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that we the members of First Baptist Church of Brady seek to minister to all persons, including those who consider themselves transgender or non-binary.
