Message from the Pastor: What can we learn from the Magi?

One of my favorite parts of the Christmas story involves the Wise Men or Magi that we are introduced to in Matthew 2. Now, I must admit before I go any further is that one of my pet peeves about our nativity scenes we see at Christmas time is that many of them show the Magi at the manger. They were nowhere near the birth of Jesus, and in fact the Bible tells us in Matthew 2:11, "entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother....." I need to make that point before I go on with this article.

Close your eyes for a moment and imagine the scene in Bethlehem. In Matthew 2, we are told that the Wise Men went to Herod to find out where the new king of the Jews had been born (Matthew 2:1-3). After this inquiry at Herod's temple, the star that they had seen in the East appeared again, leading them to the house where Mary and Joseph and the infant Jesus were now living. Contrary to our present-day nativity scenes, pageants, and plays, Jesus was not a baby when the Magi came on the scene. We can also assume by the edict that Herod issued in Matthew 2:16 that Jesus was no more than two years old. Now, even though the Magi missed the birth, the shepherds, the angels, it does not make this long journey of worship any less significant.

The Magi knew the stars, and they would have poured over many ancient texts at their disposal. They would have slogged through deserts and made their way over mountains to reach their destination. These men had probably knocked on doors and tiptoed into temples. They and their entourage rode, walked, and climbed their way from their home to a place completely foreign to them. If you slow down and actually think about this part of the story, their journey will pale in comparison to the journey of the One they went to worship. Jesus, the Son of God had the longer trip, leaving His throne in heaven and coming to live among His people.

This is why the response of the Magi was one of worship and excitement of the Christ Child. Stop and think on this moment. The Magi were men of the world, wise, cultured, and sophisticated in every way thinkable. They may have been expecting to find a young boy on a throne surrounded by servants. What they found, instead, was a child in a modest, middle class family (if you can call Mary and Joseph that right now in the story) in a quiet neighborhood. To the average person on the street that is unfamiliar with many of the ancient prophecies and the guiding star, this was very uneventful.

But to those few whose hearts were open to God's prompting and leading, who were truly seeking Jesus, they saw what the prophets had prophesied. They heard what the angels shouted. Mary understood that there in a humble tunic was the Son of God in the flesh. Imagine the scene: The Magi come to the house and knock on the door, Mary opens the door and these men drop everything and offer the only correct response to Jesus: worship. They offer the Child their gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh.

Think of the contradictions: a young child receiving the worship of royalty. The wealthy bowing before the penniless. The upside-down nature of the Kingdom of God. Do you see it, can you picture it? The Magi bow in worship of the Author of all wisdom. Remember what Solomon tells us in Proverbs 3:13, "Happy is a man who finds wisdom and who acquires understanding."

What about you as we go into 2023? Will you humbly bow at the feet of Jesus this year? Will you go deeper with the Author of all wisdom in 2023?
