Message from the Pastor: God is writing your story

In the story of Samson in Judges the betrayal of Delilah was devastating. The Philistines took Samson as a prize for their own entertainment. They shaved his head, gouged out his eyes, and chained him to a mill in the temple of the Philistia god, Dagon. The interesting and ironic thing here, my friends, is that each of the Philistines' punishments fits the way Samson lived his life.

When Samson's hair was shaved off, his strength was gone. His gouged eyes robbed him of that sense that first drew him to Philistia and its culture. Samson had lived by what seemed right in his own eyes, and the consequence was the loss of his sight. He was also robbed of his freedom to move, to travel down to the same Philistia cities he enjoyed. Samson found himself chained in one place.

The most tragic part was that he lost the presence of the Holy Spirit. God was no longer with Samson. Samson became a tool of Philistine propaganda, an object of worship to their gods. On the surface Samson's final defeat and doom seemed sure. Samson had finally come to rest in his own humiliation.

Amazingly, that is not how the story ends. As you read the ending of the story of Samson, notice this verse: "But his hair began to grow back after it had been shaved." (Judges 16:22) He was chained and blinded, and Samson's hair began to grow back. (I have always wondered if it grew back a darker or lighter color.) It is symbolic and poetic here in the original language. Who Samson really was could not be lost. God was in Samson, as He had always been.

Do you think that Samson even realized his hair was growing back? It is amazing for something as personal as our own hair; we have little control over it no matter what color we change it to. Samson was chained to the wall and might not even have been able to feel the top of his head. But God was at work. Samson's story was not over.

We all know what happened in the end: Samson defeated the Philistines who held him captive. Judges 16:28 says, "He called out to the LORD, 'LORD GOD, please remember me. Strengthen me, God, just once more. With one act of vengeance, let me pay back the Philistines for my two eyes." With one last bit of Spirit-empowered strength, he pulled down the temple and reclaimed the message of Israel's God. Samson will be remembered not only for all of his failures, but also for that final statement of faith and belief.

Your identity, your purpose, is not something you can produce on your own, no more than you can grow more hair on your head. It is yours, but you are dependent on something you do not fully possess or control. The story of Samson reminds us of our need for discernment of and submission to the story of God is writing for each of us.

God is doing something in your life. He has plans and purposes which He is calling you to embrace and recognize. God has placed you where you are to spread His message of hope, mercy, grace, and salvation through Jesus Christ. It will not always feel adventurous and it will not be all that you could imagine or would determine yourself. I promise you, though, that He will not betray, abandon, or mock you.

God is the adventure you have been looking for. He is that thing on the horizon for which you are searching in your life. He is the one who writes the better story and our calling, our highest pursuit, is to receive the work he is leading us to do. What kind of story are you already a part of? It will take faith and discernment for you to recognize it. Paul put it best when he wrote to the church in Philippi, "My goal is to know him and the power of his resurrection and the fellowship of his sufferings, being conformed to his death.....(Philippians 3:11)."
