Message from the Pastor: Pray like Jesus did

I will never forget when I actually sat down and thought about the simple words that William Walford wrote in 1845. Did he wonder if people would remember his words, or if they would just be forgotten as time passed? William Walford was a humble, uneducated, blind wood carver, but he was full of the Holy Spirit. In fact, many times in his little church in Coleshill, England, he was asked to speak and he would share his poetry with them. On one particular day, Thomas Salmon, a reporter for the New York Observer, became acquainted with William Walford. When Salmon returned to New York, he showed the editor at the New York Observer the poem William had written. The poem was published in 1845, in 1861 the composer William B. Bradbury put it to music, and in 1878 it showed up for the first time in a hymnal. Little did this simple, blind wood carver know how God would use his simple poem to minister to millions around the globe.

The second verse of Walford's poem is my favorite:

"Sweet hour of prayer, sweet hour of prayer, Thy wings shall my petition bear.
To Him whose truth and faithfulness engage the waiting soul to bless:
And since He bids me seek His face, believe His Word and trust his grace,
I'll cast on Him my every care, and wait for thee, sweet hour of prayer."

Which begs the question: Is it really that important that we spend time daily in prayer with God? In my April article we saw that prayer is a simple conversation with God. It is spending time talking, listening, asking, thanking, worshiping Him, among many other things. Prayer is vital for our relationship with Christ to grow.

In the Gospels we see something very remarkable if you really slow down and think about it. Jesus, the Son of God, the second part of the Holy Trinity, a man who was God in the flesh, spent lots of time praying to His Father. The Bible tells us that Jesus often got away by Himself to pray. Jesus went away to pray over twenty-four times. Look at the times He prayed:

When Jesus was alone and when He was with others

Before Jesus healed and after He healed individuals

Before important decisions and before meals

In the early morning hours and in the evening hours

Even being nailed to the cross and as He was dying on the cross

Jesus depended on His Father for everything, and Jesus is the Savior of the world. If Jesus needed time with God in prayer, I have a feeling we need it as well. Prayer allows us to relate to God and to be guided by Him. In all these times of prayer, Jesus was getting close to His Father, and it shows how desperate Jesus was for His Heavenly Father.

What can we learn from Jesus about praying? We learn to pray in every situation and pray about every situation. Go to God about everything. Whatever the situation or problem, talk to Him. That is what Jesus did. Now, this does not negate subsequent steps that we will take for the part we will play in this open-ended, prayer relationship we have with God. All this means is that we come to Him first.

Jesus does not want us to be intimidated by prayer. He does not want us to wonder if we are doing it "the right way" or if we are saying "the right thing." God just simply wants you and me to be in an intimate relationship with Him, and He knows that maintaining an ongoing conversation with Him throughout our life here on earth is the best way to go. I believe that William Walford would agree with the poem written by Joseph Scriven in 1855 that says:

"What a friend we have in Jesus, all our sins and griefs to bear! What a privilege to carry everything to God in prayer! Oh, what peace we often forfeit, Oh, what needless pain we bear, All because we do not carry everything to God in Prayer!"

Let us fall on our knees and spend that sweet hour of prayer with our Lord and Savior!
