Message from the Pastor: *Who is Jesus to you?*

Here is a question that mankind has been asking for two thousand plus years: “Who is this man called Jesus?” Ever since Jesus first made His appearance on this planet, men and women have been trying to figure Him out. Here is the remarkable thing for you and me: Jesus *wants* us to ask that same question. He welcomes your curiosity – even your boldness – as you investigate Him and the claims He made about Himself.

Throughout the Bible, we see God meeting people where they were, addressing not only their needs but their doubts about Him and their lack of trust in Him. Mark 9:24 tells us, “*Immediately the father of the boy cried out, ‘I do believe; help my unbelief.’*” The psalmist wrote, “*When I am filled with cares, your comfort brings me joy*” (Psalm 94:19 CSB).

One of the first questions about Jesus that has to be addressed is whether He was just a good moral teacher or He actually was who He claimed to be, the Son of God. There are many religions that say Jesus was just a great moral teacher, a prophet, or a revolutionary. We know from historians such as Tacitus, Suetonius, Pliny the Younger, and Flavius Josephus – all non-biblical sources (and yes, real people not just made-up names) that Jesus was a real individual who existed in time and space. But people are divided on who exactly Jesus was while on earth. Was He just “a great moral teacher,” as famous atheist Richard Dawkins claims, or was Jesus a humanitarian on the same lines as Mother Teresa? Or was He much more?

Those who accept Jesus as just a good moral teacher have difficulty in knowing what to do with passages like Matthew 16:13-19. In this passage, Jesus was with His disciples in Caesarea Philippi; Jesus asked them this question: “*Who do people say the Son of Man is?*” (Matthew 16:13 CSB). I can picture there was a long pause before answers just started rolling in. Then Jesus changed the question on them and asked, “*Who do YOU say that I am?*” (Matthew 16:15 CSB). Again, awkward silence. Then Peter spoke up and said, “*You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God.*” Jesus replied to Peter, “*Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah, because flesh and blood did not reveal this to you, but my Father in heaven.*” (Matthew 16:16-17 CSB). Jesus just clearly told His disciples, while affirming Peter’s answer, that He (Jesus) was in fact the Son of God.

Later, we see Jesus making equally bold claims about Himself. In John 10, some of the Jewish leaders asked Jesus to tell them plainly whether He was the Messiah, the chosen one (John 10:24). Jesus responded to them just a few verses later when He said, “*I and the Father are one*” (John 10:30 CSB). Immediately, the Jewish leaders picked up stones to put Him to death. The Jewish leaders wanted to stone Jesus because they believed that Jesus was stating He was equal with God (John 10:33 CSB).

C.S. Lewis once noted that many people say, “I’m ready to accept Jesus as a great moral teacher, but I don’t accept His claim to be God. That is the thing we must not say . . . He has not left that open to us. He did not intend to.” You see, my friends: Jesus wasn’t executed on the cross for being just a good man. He was executed on the cross because He claimed to be God. When Jesus had a chance to recant at the end, He did not back off or retract any of His statements. The prophet Isaiah tells us, “*He was oppressed and afflicted, yet He did not open his mouth. Like a lamb led to the slaughter and like a sheep silent before her shearers, He did not open His mouth.*” (Isaiah 53:7 CSB).

So, now, who do YOU say Jesus is? Was He a good man, or was Jesus actually God in the flesh? Think about the question in light of His presence in history, the eyewitness accounts telling the story of His miracles and resurrection from the dead, and His own claims to be God. Again, who do you say Jesus is? (Eternity is hanging in the balance with your answer!)

Questions for you to ponder and chew on:

How would you describe your understanding of who Jesus is? Over time how has your understanding changed of who Jesus is? What does it mean to you to say that Jesus is God? What difference does it make to declare that He is God? Why is it important to wrestle with the question of whether Jesus is just good or if He is actually God? How does resolving this question impact your faith in Him?
